An interactive workshop where participants will together create a digital collage of a biblical story. The Bible often seems dry and dusty or completely incomprehensible. In this workshop participants will hear a Bible story and then be sent out to take digital photos that bring the story to life for them. Using Twitter and Instagram, photos will be collected and then turned into a digital collage.

Prayer can be used to name injustice; lament sickness, destruction and death; to glorify God and much more. Prayer has always been part of faith-driven social movements as a way to unify struggles, collectively calm our woes, and remind ourselves (and others!) that God is bigger than the Powers that aim to deny God's goodness in the world.

Participants will discuss their experiences of prayer - good and bad, faithful or desperate, silent or shared. We will talk about how glorifying God can be a revolutionary practice. We will design tools to help bring prayer into the public square.

Meditation is the most advanced technology for the Mind that humans have come up with. It is both simple, and really hard. In this workshop you will learn how to meditate and, if you want, how to make it an important part of your life.

In the seventies, German Ballet Master Bernard Wosien took a collection of Folk Dances, combined with newer music and choreography, to the spiritual community of Findhorn, Schotland. Through those dance circles evolved Sacred Circle Dance as we know it today. No experience needed, dancing in this safe place helps us to feel connected to each other, the Earth and Creator God. I think of it as "dancing my prayer."

Geocaching is an outdoor adventure where you search for hidden treasures in the woods. It is a sport of play but can have you praying and pondering while you're enjoying the beauty of the world. Participants will engage in a short presentation before heading outdoors to find some geocaches. Where possible, download the Geocaching app on your phone or bring along your GPS. (These are not requirements to participate.)

TB2: LGBTQ2S Allyship**Max# 40****Anna White****PONDER All Ages**

This is an opportunity to explore terms relating to the LGBTQ+ spectrum and discover how you can engage in allyship. We will explore terms relating to the LGBTQ+ spectrum and discover ways to engage in allyship. Our faith communities strive to practice radical welcome in the manner that Jesus showed us. We open our hearts and doors to all, but sometimes we are unaware of exclusive societal norms. One of the most pervasive myths in our society is that there are only two sexes, male and female. The fact is, there are folks who are born intersex. The accompanying myth that there are only two genders--man and woman--allows little room for folks who experience gender outside of or across this gender binary. Participants will gain understanding of the differences between biological sex, gender identity, gender expression, and sexual orientation as well as gain strategies for trans and non-binary gender inclusivity in congregational, community, and camping life. Through interactive activities and personal reflection, we will practice striving towards allyship by examining how our own gender and sexuality privileges operate and affect our assumptions, interactions, and spaces.

TB3: Turned Upside Down by God: Christian Discipleship in the New Era.**Jessica Hetherington****Max# 25****PONDER Young Adults & Leaders**

Imagine God picking you up by your ankles, shaking you upside down, everything falling out of your pockets, then turning you right side up again! You are never the same... This
